

Saturday, October 9, 2010, Main Street Baptist Church, Georgetown, will host a one day restorative justice ministry conference. Leaders in restorative justice ministry such as Emmett Solomon, Executive Director, Restorative Justice Ministries Network; Dr. Ed Davis, Professor, Restorative Justice, Sam Houston State University and Restorative Justice Coordinator, Episcopal Diocese of Texas; Mark Hollis, Inmate Disciplex Fellowship and Richard Lopez, Director of Chaplaincy Support, TDCJ, will address the conference. Topics include an overview of restorative justice; update on legislative action that will effect prisoners and/or families of prisoners and/or restorative justice ministry; TDCJ Chaplaincy report; curriculum available for studies with inmates; challenges faced by families of prisoners, and reentry issues.

The local steering committee has designed a conference that will inform and encourage new and/or potential volunteers and refresh seasoned volunteers whose ministry is with prisoners, the formerly incarcerated and/or their families. The local steering committee members are Leslie St. Aubin, Spirit House Ministries; Tommy and Lisa Foret, Prison Fellowship volunteers; Annette Dillard, Prison Fellowship volunteer and Williamson County Juvenile Detention volunteer; and Ron Stimson, Grace Episcopal Church Evangelism Ministries, Georgetown.

Early mail-in registration is encouraged in order to take advantage of a reduced rate. Conference check-in and on site registration will begin at 8:30a.m. The program will begin at 9:00a.m. and will end at 2:30p.m.

Keynote Speaker

Judge John McMaster Williamson County Court at Law #4

John B. McMaster was appointed County Court at Law #4 judge in September 2005 and took his oath of office on January 3, 2006. County Court at Law #4 was approved during the 2005 legislative session and became effective in January 2006.

Before being appointed as judge, John McMaster had a private law practice focusing on family law in Georgetown. He previously served as a member of the Georgetown Independent School District Board, serving as board secretary for part of his tenure. He is a member of the Kiwanis in Georgetown, the Williamson County coalition against underage drinking, the Masonic Lodge and Celebration Church in Georgetown.

Judge McMaster graduated from Georgetown High School in 1975, received his bachelor's degree from Baylor University in 1979 and graduated in 1982 from South Texas College of Law. He lives in Georgetown with his wife and daughter.
